

Moravian Warmblood (MT)

What does it mean a Moravian Warmblood horse?

You ought to imagine yourself a noble warm-blooded horse of a middle rectangular figure, with a withers height at mares of 159 - 165 cm and at stallions of 161 - 167 cm with harmonic body parts. With noble dry head, with oval orbit and a big vital eye. With a middle till long neck, outstanding withers, with long sideways shoulder blade, which enables productive and spacious motion. Its middle deep, middle long and oval chest with measures up to 205 cm is a presumption of a good ability for feeding.

The middle short till middle long upper line is well connected with middle long and strong shoulder. The ars is mighty, long and oval. The extremities are dry, rawboned, with expressive dry joins and ligaments.

The shank reaches up to 19,5 till 22,5 cm.

The fetlocks are middle long, strong and elastic.

The hoofs are reasonably wide strong and tough.

Where does it lie the origin of the Moravian warmblood horse?

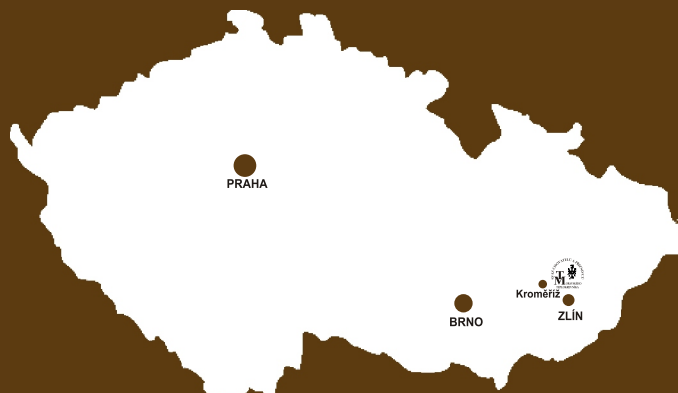
It lives here with us for long generations. Warm-blooded horses, kept on the territory of the former Czechoslovakia in Moravia, in the first row horses with pedigree (genes) of the origins Austro-Hungarian tribes (Furioso, Przedswit, Gidran, North Star, Star of Hannover, Nonius, Shagya) and the line Catalin. These horses were in the passed years registered as the Czech Warmblood (ČT), which lead to their restriction.

A group of enthusiasts started in the year 1996 to work to save and regenerate the resting horses of this origin. The Society of Breeders and Friends of the Moravian Warmblood (SCHPMT) was established and this society worked very intensively for approval of these horses as a separate race. This trying was successfully finished by an approval of an independent race through the decision of the Ministry for Agriculture of the Czech republic.

The named voluntary society became on the 01.04. 2004 a state society with the right to keep the stud book.

We can so stand for, that this horse of an excellent character and a reasonable temperament, very willing to work, with valid health and a hard constitution, which can be used under saddle as in carriage will be kept for the coming generations, too.
